## Training camp held for World Championship Field and 3D Teams

Last month four archers and three team officials took part in a weekend's field training camp as they prepare for international glory in not one but two competitions. The training camp was split over two days and saw the archers battle the elements first at Lakeview Archers in the Waikato and then at Massey Archery Club.

Regan Walters and team manager Trinity Sarjant are off to the 2024 World Archery 3D Championships which takes place in Mokrice, Slovenia at the beginning of October.

Archers Kelly Atkinson, Emily Cavell and Max Maggs (ably supported by team managers Janis Blake and Fleur Maggs) are heading to Lac La Biche in Canada for the 2024 World Archery Field Championships - 16-22 September where they will be joined by Lily Brislen.

Lily Brislen is already in Canada and has spent the northern summer teaching archery to kids at a camp three hours' drive north of Toronto. Since camp finished, she's taken part in the Archery Alberta Outdoor Target Provincials, taking gold in her division in both a Double 720 and the Field competition.

The training camp wrapped up after the teams were presented with their New Zealand shirts by Murray Prowse – Archery NZ Board Deputy Chair. We look forward to seeing them do us all proud on the world stage.



# Ivan Powley 1937-2024

## Archer- Administrator- Innovator

It is with sadness that we note the passing away of Ivan Powley on 15/8/2024 at St Andrew's, Dunedin, after a long battle with illness.

Ivan's much loved wife Ann, and his daughter Christine, have cared for him and nurtured him since he became ill in 2018, they will miss him, as will many other people.

### Ivan's Archery Service and Achievements

Ivan has been an archer for more than 60 years. Ivan is a Life Member of Archery NZ (awarded 1995), South Island Districts Archery Association (SIDAA) and the Dunedin Archery Club (DAC).

These Life memberships of three Archery organisations are an indication of the respect that Ivan Powley has earned in a career covering more than 60 years in a sport that Ivan was passionate about and worked very hard to improve the sport in many ways.

Ivan's contributions to Archery in NZ make a very long list. Ivan attended FITA Congress and achieved improvements in the way that Tournaments are run, Managed the Olympic Team (in LA 1984), and a number of World Championship teams.

**Clubs Committee:** Acts as a conduit for communication between the Board and the clubs. *This committee is currently below quorum and ready to welcome new members!*

**Organisational Management Committee:** Makes recommendations to the Board regarding policies and processes.

**Rules Committee:** Makes recommendations to the Board regarding changes to the Shooting and Tournament rules.

**Finance and Risk Committee:** Manages the assets, finances and budgets, supports LOCs of National Tournaments and applies for grant funding.

**High Performance Committee:** Makes recommendations to the Board regarding selection criteria, officials for travelling teams, promotes opportunities for high performance archers, coach training and opportunities for coach development.

**Membership and Development Committee:** Develops programs to support our club and development archers, such as postal and tertiary leagues.

**Wellbeing and Inclusion Committee:** Promotes the inclusion of all age groups, genders, abilities, cultural and religious backgrounds, and sexual orientations.

# FISU World University Games

Information is coming in for the Rhine-Ruhr FISU University Games 2025. The dates of the competition are 17 - 28 July 2025, with the Archery competition being held in the city of Essen.



## Eligibility

- The University Games are for archers **under 25 years old**.
- Archers can come from **any Tertiary Institute as long as you are studying for a Degree or Diploma**. Archers who are not studying at a University will need to have their entry endorsed by UTSNZ.
- Archers who have finished their degree/diploma in the year before (i.e. this year) are still eligible to apply.
- Archers have to meet the selection criteria for a **Tier Two event** under the Archery NZ Selection Policy.
- Qualifying scores must be achieved by 26 February 2025.
- You need to submit an [Expression of Interest](#) if you are thinking about going. This does not commit you in any way, it just helps the selectors to know who to be watching when considering selecting the team. It does need to be completed as soon as possible.

This is a very exciting opportunity for our tertiary archers to get out on the world stage. We have the talent; it is time to shine!
